



### INTERPRETATION EXAMPLE FROM JAMES 1:1-18

Observation	Questions	Answers
Written to the twelve tribes scattered abroad	Who are these people to whom James writes?	<b>Content:</b> We know these people have something to do with Judaism because of the reference to the twelve tribes of Israel (1:1). However, this book is written to Christians and therefore must be to converted Jews (Jewish Christians).
		<b>Context:</b> Refers to the synagogue, not church, and therefore gives valid proof of their Jewish background. Also, notice the extensive use of Old Testament stories (James 2:25; 5:11, 17). Also, he calls Abraham ''our father'' (2:21).
		<b>Comparison:</b> Many early Christians were Jewish converts (Acts 1—7). Luke 22:30 uses the term twelve tribes to speak of Israel. John 7:35 refers to the Jews scattered among the Gentiles. The Old Testament refers to this scattering of the Jews in Psalm 147:2; Isaiah 11:12; 56:8; Zephaniah 3:10.
		<b>Commentaries:</b> James was written early, even before the Jerusalem Council, around A.D. 45, to the Jewish converts scattered throughout the Roman Empire. Ironside, in his commentary, <i>James and Peter</i> , says: "The letter was addressed, not to any individual church or group of churches, as such, but to the twelve tribes of Israel in the Dispersion, those twelve tribes of whom Paul speaks in his address before Agrippa'' (Acts 26:7). This letter was widely circulated to these groups meeting in the old synagogues.
		<b>Conclusions:</b> The twelve tribes scattered abroad are Jewish Christians with unique challenges to face because of their heritage. They are located throughout the Roman Empire.




# Paul's First Missionary Journey




